## "Order"

The keystone of this spare group show is a black-and-white Photostat from 1964 by the great Romare Bearden: a trio of card players arranged around a small kitchen table. The piece sets a tone of deceptive restraint that belies a riveting intricacy. Joining two Chicago veterans-the painter Christina Ramberg, who died in 1995, and the sculptor Richard Rezac-is the Bay Area newcomer K.r.m. Mooney, whose cunning arrangements of industrial effluvia (wire, vinyl, copper fittings) rest modestly on the floor. But the standout here is Melvin Edwards, whose wall-mounted sculptures of welded locks, chains, and hooks are at once abstract and heavy-hearted. Through Jan. 31.
