## GOINGS ON ABOUT TOWN: ART

## **WALT KUHN**

In this season of George Bellows redux (a big retrospective just closed at the Met), how about the unjustly neglected American modern Kuhn, who died in 1949? Admit it: you've never seen one of Kuhn's portraits of circus folk and showgirls that didn't make you look twice. A large show tracks his early absorption of Cubist and Expressionist ideas to the shock of his maturity: all of that energetic sophistication condensed into a style as simple and potent as a clenched fist. (Imagine Watteau channelled by Max Beckmann.) The subjects are —and know—themselves with a stilled intensity that is exciting to confront and humbling to contemplate. Through March 16.
