DC Moore Gallery: “Joyce Kozloff: Girlhood”

October 5 through November 4, 2017

Opening Reception: Thursday, October 5 at 6 p.m.

DC Moore Gallery will present “Joyce Kozloff: Girlhood,” featuring mixed media art by the feminist artist. For the work in this exhibition, Joyce Kozloff blended her signature cartographic art with her own childhood drawings. After her parents’ deaths, Kozloff unearthed folders of childhood drawings and mixed them with her meticulously painted archaic maps, charts, informational graphs and more, creating a dialogue between youthful wonderment and adult geographical knowledge. The exhibition will also include so-called “satellite paintings,” in which Kozloff re-drew and re-contextualized her childhood drawings utilizing children’s art supplies, such as chalk and crayon. Collages from her 2001-2002 series, “Boys’ Art,” will also be on display alongside copies of her son’s childhood superhero and war drawings.
